

7. Let us Solve our own Problems

Let's Revise

1. Issues in civic life:

- i. The difficulties faced by people in cities and villages are called problems or issues in civic life.
- ii. We face several such issues in our day to day life. These are sometimes temporary, but can cause inconvenience and disorder in our daily routine.
- iii. These issues if neglected can become bigger. Hence it is necessary to identify such issues and solve them at the earliest.
- iv. Such issues cannot be solved by a single person and hence requires the co-operation and efforts of all people of the society.

2. Solving disputes:

- i. Several disputes may arise between different people over various issues in towns and villages.
- ii. If such disputes keep arising regularly, it hampers the well-being of the village or town.
- iii. This can also lead to loss of unity thus creating a barrier in the progress of the village.
- iv. Petty disputes can be solved locally by discussion among the arguing parties.
- v. However the serious disputes need to be taken to appropriate bodies or the courts.
- vi. In Maharashtra, 'Mahatma Gandhi Dispute-Free Village Mission' has been implemented since 2007. This scheme aims to solve the disputes in the village through peaceful discussions. This increases harmony in the villages. Moreover, a peace award is given to those villages which have solved their disputes using this method.
- vii. In cities, Mohalla committees help to solve the disputes.

3. **Problem solving:**

Some attempts made by people at solving the civic problems are given below.

i. Hiware Bazaar:

- a. The village of Hiware Bazaar in Ahmadnagar district in Maharashtra was facing water shortage problem. There was also scarcity of fodder for animals.
- b. However, the participation of the villagers helped to solve these problems.
- c. They also developed lush green surroundings.

ii. Cleaning a village through 'shramdaan':

- a. 'Shramdaan' means voluntary contribution of labour.
- b. The people of Khudawadi, in Osmanabad district, implemented shramdaan, whereby everyone was urged to help in cleaning of the village.
- c. Measures were taken to deal with the waste water.
- d. Manure was made from garbage using vermiculture.
- e. Also, a toilet was built in every house.

iii. Work of Sant Gadgebaba:

- a. Sant Gadgebaba stressed on the importance of cleanliness in villages through his kirtans.
- b. He also demonstrated the same through his own actions.
- c. He made people understand how cleanliness, education and self-reliance can lead to progress.

iv. Work of Rashtrasant Tukdoji Maharaj:

- a. He composed 'Gram Geeta' to explain the importance of cleanliness to people.
- b. 'मिळोनी करावी ग्रामसफाई। नाली, मोरी ठायीठायी। हस्ते परहस्ते साफ सर्वहि। चहूकडे मार्ग।'
- c. In the above verse from Gram Geeta, Rashtrasant Tukdoji Maharaj says that, 'Everyone should help in cleaning of the village. Every corner of the village should be cleaned. You should not just participate yourself, but also encourage others to participate in cleaning of the village. This cleanliness drive should be extended in all the directions.'



4. Maintaining peace in society:

- i. To create a peaceful environment in our family, school and community,
 - a. The basic needs of all sections of the society should be met.
 - b. Each person in the society must feel secure.
 - c. We must stop the exploitation in society to decrease inequality.
 - d. Everyone should have the right to participate in public life.
 - e. Everyone should learn the importance of peace and use peaceful methods for solving problems.
- ii. A peaceful environment in family, school and community benefits everyone.
- iii. Peace is a social value which contributes significantly to the progress of a society and creates scope for advances in fields like business, industry, education, art, literature, entertainment, science and technology.
- iv. The United Nations has designated 21st September as 'International Peace Day'.
- v. On this day a bell made from coins given by people from around 60 countries, is rung at 10 o'clock in the morning. It is then followed by a few moments of silence.
- vi. The aim of celebrating this day is to spread peace worldwide and help nations to strive for the development of their people.


